

Millage Approved!

Kent County voters overwhelmingly approved the Ready by Five Early Childhood Millage on November 6, 2018.

The six-year millage generates approximately \$6.5 million each year of dedicated funding for community-based early childhood programs, ensuring children and their families have access to vital services.



Goals of Ready by Five

Increase early learning opportunities and child health by increasing access to quality programming for expecting mothers and children ages 0-5 in Kent County

Increase cross-sector collaboration between providers to ensure families are being connected with needed services in the form of a warm handoff through referrals and data sharing

Reduce outcome disparities across specific target populations by ensuring culturally relevant services that are inclusive of all populations as well as supporting programs that serve traditionally underserved community members based on their racial or ethnic background, zip code of residence, or cultural factors



Millage Process Established



- Proposals submitted by service providers
- Resident Proposal Review Board, featuring 4 parents, recommends funding
- Approval by First Steps Kent Commission, then Kent County Board of Commissioners
- Currently preparing for our 6th round of funding
- Fund 30 partner organizations, through more than 40 programs
- Have served approximately 15,000 children and expectant parents
