




### **Key Summer Learning Elements**



# Student outcomes were educationally meaningful for high-attending students

- High-attenders (20+ days) in the first summer saw math benefits persisting through spring
- High attenders in the second summer had math and language arts benefits persisting through spring – as well as benefits in SEL
- Time on task and quality of instruction also linked to greater benefits
- Among students who attended at least one day, about 60% were high attenders



# Summer is a time when inequities can increase across many areas

The National Academies of Science, Engineering and Medicine – the nation's most prestigious scientific society –published a consensus study on summer

- "Summertime experiences can affect academic, health, social and emotional, and safety outcomes for children and youth, with those in disadvantaged communities at risk for worse outcomes."
- "There are opportunities for systems and agents to implement innovative new programs and extend effective practices that already exist during the school year into the summer period."






## **OST at a glance:**

- Youth served 15,775
- Programs 45
- Percent of youth demonstrating academic or social emotional growth – 85%
- Percent of youth not failing any academic course during the school year 61%
- Percent of youth who are not chronically absent- 61%







Chronic absence is defined as missing 10% or 18 days during the school year

**Crestview Scholars** – program for culturally and linguistically diverse 3rd and 4th graders

- Programming includes a well-rounded schedule of academic instruction, recreation, and multi-generational family engagement opportunities.

## **Expand capacity of programming & remove employment barriers for youth**

#### **Evelyn K. Davis Center for Working** Families

110/136 chose to disclose their race as non-white

#### **Oakridge Neighborhood Services**

- 61/62 African American
- 1/62 Latino

"Increased our capacity to **provide supportive transportation services** for up to 70 students who shared that transportation was a barrier towards maintaining steady employment and program participation. This helped increase our program completion rate to 94% as some of our students would have dropped out without the transportation option."

"Increased our capacity to expand our program by increasing the number of hours and hourly rate for youth and extend opportunities for our youth into year-round employment. Our youth also received summer academic support and employment skill training for 10 weeks."







## **Next Steps and Lessons Learned**

- ✓ Summer Programs need to include academic and enrichment components
- ✓ Career exposure activities can start as early as 3<sup>rd</sup> grade
- ✓ Focus on college exposure and career exploration in late elementary school and throughout middle school
- Hands-on career readiness activities are appropriate for middle school students
- High school youth should be focused on paid summer employment opportunities with support for soft skills
