Sharon Contreras, Ph.D. Chief Executive Officer, Innovation Project, North Carolina



Dr. Sharon Contreras is the CEO of The Innovation Project in North Carolina, a collaborative of school districts committed to high academic achievement and equity through innovation. Dr. Contreras has held two superintendencies and is celebrated for implementing policies and practices aimed at improving student life outcomes. In Guilford County, her team expanded access to Advanced Placement courses, career technical education and dual-enrollment programming, preparing students *and their*

parents for the workforce. GCS' high-impact tutoring initiative and learning hubs are considered a national model. In 2022, the GCS graduation rate reached a high of 91.8%. Contreras was North Carolina PTA's Superintendent of the Year (2019), was among Triad Business Journal's Most Admired CEOs in 2020 and named to the *Business North Carolina Power List 2022*.

AJ Gutierrez is the Co-Founder, Vice Chair & Chief of Marketing & Communications at Saga Education. Prior to this, they were with SAGA Innovations, Summer Search, and Match Education. AJ has also served as a Corps Member with City Year and as a

Kevin Huffman CEO, Accelerate



Kevin Huffman is the founding CEO of Accelerate, a national initiative that seeks to embed high-impact tutoring and personalized learning in public schools. Previously, Huffman was a partner with City Fund. Huffman is the former Tennessee commissioner of education, where he managed the state department of education in its effort to advance the academic progress of nearly one million students. During Huffman's tenure, Tennessee had the largest state gains on the National

Assessment of Educational Progress. Huffman began his education career as a bilingual teacher in the Houston Independent School District. After attending law school, he represented school districts, state departments of education and universities. Huffman joined the senior management of Teach For America in 2000, serving as general counsel, senior vice president of growth strategy and development, and executive vice president of public affairs. Huffman graduated from Swarthmore College with a B.A., and from the New York University School of Law.

Carly Robinson, Ph.D. Director of Research, National Student Support Accelerator, Stanford University



Carly Robinson is a Postdoctoral Research Associate at the Annenberg Institute at Brown University. Her research interests sit at the intersection of education, psychology, and policy. In particular, she draws on insights from social psychology and behavioral science to design and experimentally test interventions that improve social support for students. Some of her recent work focuses on strengthening teacher-student relationships and mobilizing effective family engagement. As a

complement to her applied research, her methodological work emphasizes open science practices, such as preregistering hypothesis-testing studies. Prior to conducting educational research, Carly worked as a New York City teacher. She holds a PhD in Education from Harvard University, a Master's in Applied Positive Psychology from the University of Pennsylvania, and BA in Psychology from Williams College.
