Purpose and Design of the School Pulse Panel (SPP)

- COVID-19 learning disruptions led to directives in Executive Order 14000 and the American Rescue Plan Act to conduct studies on those disruptions
- A key response was to start a monthly pulse study of public schools
- Coordinated with federal agencies and K-12 public schools and systems




Redesigned Study Design – January 2022

- 2,400 public elementary, middle/combined, and secondary/high schools (Initial + 1st Reserve Sample)
- Intend for a committed panel of 1,000 schools
- Screener for updated point of contact information Nov & Dec
- 30-minute monthly survey sent electronically to principals or designated points of contact at the school
- Survey open for two weeks each month
- \$400 reimbursement for each month a completed survey is submitted debit cards to be sent after each month






Monthly Content: School Year 2021-22

OVERVIEW OF RAPID NATIONAL SURVEYS

Ongoing, monthly survey. Households with at least one child under age 6. Began April 6, 2020

Added parallel national child care provider survey in 2021


15-minute paid questionnaires completed via computer or smartphone in English or Spanish

Surveyed more than **15,000 households and 2,800 providers** in all 50 states

National sample in terms of **geography, income and race/ethnicity**




