History in West Virginia

2007

DPIL was launched in 13 ARC counties using lottery interest funds and ARC funds. Later this year, the program expanded to 24 counties.

2015

West Virginia Department of Education and the Arts allocated \$350,000 towards DPIL in WV. This allowed for the onboarding of the counties who were cut in 2012.

2012

Lottery interest funds were depilated, and program and operations were scaled back to the 13 original counties. 2016

The West Virginia Leaders of Literacy Campaign for Grade-Level Reading grant allowed for 14 additional counties to launch DPIL using campaign funds.



2019

Oversight of DPIL in WV shifted to the West Virginia Department of Education's Early and Elementary Learning Services. A partnership between Early and Elementary Learning Services and the June Harless Center began with the goal of expanding DPIL in WV.

2021

DPIL launches statewide. All 55 counties in WV began full participation in the program with no limitations. Full participation is made possible by local and statewide fundraising efforts.

2020

In July, all 55 counties in WV were participating in the program in some capacity.

How this works

Each **local affiliate program** enrolls children, promotes the program in its community and secures funds for the cost of books and mailing.

The WVDE and the June Harless Center

provides support to local affiliate programs by generating state and national public awareness, provides ongoing technical assistance, and provides all startup help to local affiliates.

The **Dollywood Foundation** manages selection, pricing, and distribution of the books.



- Community partners are needed to support awareness building, child enrollment, and fundraising efforts.

Promoting Awareness

We find the greatest success in spreading awareness of the Imagination Library Program is to build awareness in our community through attending events, hanging flyers, posters, etc.





- While the books are free to families, it cost approximately \$2.10 per child per month to mail and distribute books. Fundraising is a great way to offset these expenses and ensure continued program growth.

- Over 1,400 guests attended the private event, which included a fireside chat with Marshall University President Brad D. Smith and a musical performance by Dolly.
- Governor Jim Justice proclaimed August 9 as Imagination Library Day in West Virginia.


