She is also a member of Mid-Iowa Health Foundation's HealthConnect Fellowship where she is concentrating on a

Following that success, the Early Childhood Initiative of Northwest Georgia was formed. Made possible by the Anna Sue and Bob Shaw Foundation, the organization strives to assure that young children from the region have access to the highest quality, early education resources available. The organization works to put ALL children on the path to reading on grade level by 3rd grade.

Whitfield/Dalton has received numerous state and national recognitions and over 13.5 million dollars in funding including: the PBS Kids Family Initiative Grant; 21st Century Afterschool; and has been designated as both a Bright Spot and a Pacesetter community by the Campaign for Grade-Level Reading.
