

# Less than half of elementary teacher reading licensure tests adequately assess the core components of scientifically based reading instruction


- → 11 tests are acceptable (including 6 strong tests)
- → 14 tests are weak
  - 10 do not address all components
  - 5 combine reading with other subjects



## Fewer than half of states use strong reading licensure tests



## Only 28% of elementary prep programs adequately address all five core components of reading






# to Lifetime Success




