Leah serves on the Executive Board of the Michigan Reading Association as its Immediate Past President, on the state's Early Literacy Task Force, and on Detroit's adult literacy task force. She is editor of *The Michigan Reading Journal* and part-time faculty at Eastern Michigan University. Most importantly, she is the mama of a neurodiverse little human who is a student in a Detroit public school and is teaching her how to build with LEGO.
