

#### The Children Services Council

- Recognizing that the needs of children in Broward County far exceeded the resources and support systems available, a referendum creating the Children Services (CSC) as a special independent taxing district was overwhelmingly approved by voters in September 2000 and re-affirmed in November 2014.
- The CSC's mission is to provide leadership, advocacy and resources necessary to enhance the lives of the children of Broward County and empower them to become responsible, productive adults.

  - Hurricanes, Marjory Stoneman Douglas Mass Shooting, Community Gun Violence, Flooding



- Proactively invest in behavioral health system of care improvements
- Trauma Focused Cognitive
   Behavioral Therapy plus multiple
   other therapeutic modalities
- Community Conversations

- Partnership with school board to support the Center for Mind Body Medicine
- Federal Grant in Development of Community Wellness Center
- Sustainable funding



## Ways Philanthropy Can Take Action Before, Immediately After and in the months and years following a disaster.

- Facilitate opportunities to learn and listen to community members, build longer-term relationships (ABCD)
- Creation of the HEAL Trauma Program or similar model
- Funding for Covington Trauma- Responsive System Trainings
