

- · Be inclusive of all the potential places and people that can contribute to a literacy-rich ecosystem
- Activate literacy-rich environments in the places and spaces where children and their caregivers naturally are and want to be
- Co-create literacy-rich environments with family and community members
- Embrace a broad range of outcomes 5. Maximize collaboration, networking, and shared learning

What Funders Can Do (recommendations)

- · Rethink traditional approaches to grantmaking to allow for meaningful community engagement
- Invest and engage in community-centered evaluation
- Think systemically about the constellation of grants across a city to create a literacy-rich environment ecosystem
- Educate stakeholders on the value of play
- Embrace a theory of change that recognizes the multi-faceted nature of supporting literacy

Kids Are Sponges


